The Curriculum Development in Practice course is a 6-month product-driven project, to support schools to further develop and embed low-variance curriculum in learning areas in their schools.

Teach Well, through the Curriculum

Development in Practice course, will support
curriculum teams to develop and embed lowvariance curriculum.

A dedicated in-person course for curriculum teams will commence in Term 1, 2026.

Project overview

- » Short review of key ideas for curriculum development to align the work across schools.
- » Structured sharing of curriculum across school teams.
- » Structured time for teams to plan their curriculum development between workshops.
- » Time at workshops to work on curriculum development.
- » Peer support and feedback at the workshop days, including from internal Teach Well experts.
- » Expert coaching opportunities between workshop days with the Teach Well team.

Project outputs

Curriculum teams will complete the project with the following outputs:

- » A clear process and plan for curriculum development in their learning area. This process can be replicated in subsequent years for additional year levels.
- » A low-variance scope and sequence incorporating a set of drafted Learning Objectives.
- » A Systematic Review Plan for at least one term.
- » Longer cadence reviews for at least one term.

Curriculum teams will also have the opportunity to further develop:

- » Lesson componentry, including hinge-point questions, vocabulary and key concept glossaries, guided notes or unit booklets with key componentry such as graphic organisers, diagrams, text-dependent questions, resources for gradual release of skills, such as agreed steps and example sets.
- $\ensuremath{\mathsf{n}}$ Daily Review content mapped to scope and sequence.
- » Daily Review materials, including single sequences or automaticity content.



Curriculum teams commit to:

» Attending 3 workshop days

» Completing a total of 14 hours of individual work across the project:

- Attending the 3 workshop days,
- 2 hours pre-project,
- 6 hours between each session.

This is to enable the drafting/ refinement of the school-level curriculum.

» Completing an additional 3-5 hours of team work with their curriculum team:

This can be meeting/ collaboration/ staff development day time that is already scheduled and will ensure the input and feedback from the team into the drafted/ refined curriculum.

Total time commitment:

<u>-40 hours across 3 terms</u>
