Application Process

Who can apply?

When selecting schools, priority will be given to schools that meet the following criteria to ensure they can make the most of the TIM Series. Schools should:

- 1. have stable school leadership.
- 2. have the ability to send at least 2 teachers from Year 7-8 who commit to using the Ochre resources and completing all components of the TIM Series.
- commit for their Principal and Maths leader to attend the TIM workshop (with teachers) and the Leading TIM workshop for school leaders. Other school leaders are also encouraged to attend as relevant.

What does it cost?

Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) will cover the professional learning costs of the TIM Series.

What does my school commit to?

Leaders should be willing to:

- » support their teachers to film and submit 5–10 minutes of classroom footage.
- » participate in a case study if requested.

Teachers should:

- » have a desire to use Ochre resources in their classroom.
- » be teaching Year 7 and/or Year 8 in 2024.
- » be willing to complete teacher surveys and pre-readings.
- » be committed to completing the self-reflection and video instructional coaching cycle.
